ADMISSIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The following states Albany Technical College's ("the College") policies and procedures governing the admissions process:

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Admission to a Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) college is a multi-step process which consists of evaluation of prior academic experience and assessment for postsecondary readiness of eligible applicants.

Albany Technical College adheres to the TCSG policy stated above and defines the following for the purpose of admissions to the College. Future students must:

1. Students must have successfully completed a technical certificate of credit or diploma program with a GPA of 2.5 or higher within five years of their admission.
2. 2.5 G.P.A will be calculated by Registrar and reviewed by Program Advisor.
3. General Education Development [GED®] scores of 165+ on English or Math.
4. Adult Education students demonstrating academic readiness at the secondary education level of 8th grade or higher; or completed at least one section of the GED Test with a score of 150, and/or have attained GED Ready Test Scores of 150 or higher in Reading or Math are approved for admission into Entry Level Workforce Certificates without Accuplacer testing.
5. Georgia Milestones Literature & Composition or Georgia Milestones American Literature & Composition (English admission requirement only).
6. HOPE GPA after completion of 10th grade of 2.6 or higher or high school GPA of 2.0 for approved Entry Level Workforce Certificates..
7. Assessment results will be valid for any current or previous tool utilized for placement
8. Attend the specific area of study Orientation, if applicable.
9. Register for classes during the dates specified on the Student Calendar.

TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to ATC who have been previously enrolled at a post-secondary institution will be considered for admission under the following criteria:

1. Applicants who are in good standing at their previous institution may be accepted in good standing.
2. Applicants who are on academic probation at their previous institution may be accepted only on academic probation.
3. Applicants who are on academic or disciplinary suspension will not be accepted unless they have satisfied the conditions of their suspension and are eligible for re-admission into their former college.

Applicants for transfer admission must submit the following to the Admissions Office:

1. Application for Admissions and a \$25.00 non-refundable fee;
2. Official transcript(s) from each post-secondary institution attended;
3. Official high school transcript;

NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE

Admissions Applications are processed and the names of applicants placed on a list for program admission on a first-come priority. Students are notified by regular mail, electronic mail, or in person, of their acceptance into a program, and how to register for classes.
