Admission Requirements for International Student Applicants Requesting I-20: Certificate of Eligibility for Student (F-1) Status

- 1. Submit an Application for Admission to Albany Technical College, ATTN: International Student Admissions, with a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee.
- 2. Present an original document certifying immigrant or non-immigrant status. (Examples: Passport, Visa, permanent resident alien card, I-20, etc.).
- 3. Submit financial statements, financial documentation:
 - a. **Affidavit of Support** showing that you have funds to finance your education.
 - b. Certified statement from your bank, or sponsor's bank, showing that the required funds are available. (Example: \$16,282 for 12 months balance).
 - c. Additional documents substantiating your ability to support yourself or the student financially. **Financial Documentation.**
- 4. Submit proof of proficiency in the English language - TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language). Minimum Score Requirements: Paper and pencil: 500; Computer-based: 173; Internet-based: 61
- 5. Submit official High School transcript.*
- 6. Submit Official College or University transcripts.*
- 7. Submit satisfactory SAT, ACT, or Compass test scores.
- 8. Submit proof of current health insurance coverage.
- 9. Pay one term semester's tuition and fees totaling \$4,533 to Albany Technical College. Amount subject to change check webpage at www.albanytech.edu > Admissions > International Students).
- 10. Pay **SEVIS Fee** prior to interview with U.S. consulate.
- 11. Submit a **Transfer Clearance Form** to your Advisor at your current College, if applicable.

Admission to a credit program is a selective process and international students must meet the requirements for admission. International applicants must have a complete file before they can be accepted to a credit program of study. Once official acceptance is granted, a letter is mailed to the applicant. The admissions assistant will then request that an F-1 student visa be issued to the accepted applicant by the DHS-CIS.

****If transcripts are in a language other than English, an official translation is required. Foreign postsecondary educational credentials must have a course-by-course evaluation by an Independent Evaluation Service that is a member of NACES® - National Association of Credential Evaluation Services. Photocopies and faxes are not acceptable.***
